Building the Future of Arkansas' Rural Communities in Cooperation with Students from E.A.S.T.

AUTIS recently began a pilot project working with E.A.S.T students to help define the impact of the lack of availability of Broadband in rural communities.



The EAST Initiative began in 1996 in a single classroom in rural Arkansas and has since grown to over 230 schools in six states. In 2001, EAST incorporated as a 501(c)(3) non-profit governed by a Board of Directors comprised of business, education, and government leaders. Working together with a dedicated executive and program staff, the EAST Initiative succeeds in delivering a relevant and life-changing experience for students that produces value for schools, communities, and the workforce.

About AUTIS:

The Association for Users of Telecommunications and Information Systems promotes the advancement of professional and technical knowledge in telecommunications and information systems management technologies. The organization is recognized as the only regional organization of its kind in Arkansas.

History:

In June 1983, a meeting of forty-one individuals formed the present association, AUTIS - Association for Users of Telecommunications and Information Systems. AUTIS has been founded as a voluntary nonprofit organization, exclusively for educational and charitable purposes.

Today, AUTIS pursues the advancement of education by providing a forum for members and non-members who are interested in the rapidly changing fields of telecommunications and information systems. The forum provides the basis for the exchange of ideas, personal experiences and similar pertinent information. AUTIS also supplies to educational institutions, charitable organizations, and other organizations, speakers who are knowledgeable in telecommunications and information systems. By request, free communications and information systems consultation will be provided to organizations that qualify.

Above all, the EAST educational model is student-centered. EAST is a nationally recognized as an innovative, relevant, and successful approach to education. EAST is a project-based, service-learning class that provides students with the most current, high-end technologies available in some of the most progressive fields in the world. However, EAST is more than a class offering and much more than a "computer class". At its heart, EAST is a coordinated attempt to provide today's students with an educational atmosphere that allows them to gain insight into their own abilities to acquire and use information, solve problems, and gain valuable experience on their way to becoming life-long learners. For educators, EAST provides an opportunity to focus on the strengths and develop the weaknesses of individual students. EAST classrooms are for all students.
